INTRODUCTION

The 2025 North Australian Surf Lifesaving Championships attracts competitors from Queensland and Northern Territory, providing an opportunity to unite over three days showcasing one of Queensland's most iconic volunteer movements, Surf Life Saving.

This year's event will be held as follows:

Friday 31st October 2025 - Mackay Aquatics and Recreation Complex, 193 Boundary Road Ooralea.

Saturday 1st November 2025 – Sunday 2nd November 2025 - Mackay Harbour Beach

This document outlines some key information relating to the North Australian Championships. Please note that SLSQ may have subsequent bulletins which may supersede information provided in the bulletin.

COMPETITION COMMITTEE

The Competition Committee (CC) will direct all matters relating to the actual conduct of the competition. The CC may, in accordance with the rules contained in the current edition - *of the Surf Sports Manual*, any subsequent amending bulletins and this circular, postpone, cancel and or alter any or all events at the Championships, and/or alter the venue of the competition.

The CC may consult and seek advice from officials, athletes and other personnel on competition conditions and safety issues when required. The CC shall appoint the various sub committees and panels as required for the event e.g. Disciplinary Committee & Coach/Athlete Panel.

DISTRIBUTION OF BULLETIN

It is most important that the information in this Bulletin is brought to the attention of all Carnival Officials, Team Managers, Coaches and Competitors.

Non-receipt of the Bulletin will not be taken as an excuse if a Club, Team or individual does not comply with the requirements outlines in this and other Bulletins and Circulars.

ELIGIBILITY TO COMPETE

The age of competitors will range from Under 11 to Masters.

Events will be conducted in accordance with the SLSA Surf Sports Manual, current Edition, AND any subsequent Bulletins issued from Surf Life Saving Australia and/or Surf Life Saving Queensland.

Pool Rescue Events, whilst adhering to the SLSA Surf Sports Manual, will also be conducted in accordance with the ILS Competition Manual, AND any subsequent Bulletins.

A copy of these manuals/rules can be found on www.ilsf.org and also via the SLS Hub.

All competitors wishing to be nominated for the 2025 North Australian Championships (NAC) **MUST** have attained their relevant award/s and/or applicable **2025/26** Competition Evaluation by the close of nominations at **midnight on Sunday 19th October 2025**. (**NOTE: These Swims must be for the 2025/26 season and not from the 2024/25 season**)

Under 10's may compete in Under 11 team events only.

ALL Under 15 competitors **MUST** have a current and proficient Surf Rescue Certificate to be eligible to compete at the 2025 NAC (Under 14 competitors competing 'up' in Under 15 TEAM events **MUST** also have a current and proficient Surf Rescue Certificate).

ALL Under 17, Under 19, Open and Masters' competitors **MUST** have a current and proficient Bronze Medallion to be eligible to compete at the 2025 NAC.

ALL U15, U17, U19, Open and Masters' competitors **MUST** have completed a Proficiency ('Skills Maintenance') Test by 31 December 2024 OR have completed a Proficiency ('Skills Maintenance') Test for the 2025/26 Season prior to the start of competition. Those members gaining Surf Rescue Certificates and/or Bronze Medallions during the 2024/25 season, prior to the start of competition, will be considered as satisfying the proficiency requirements for entry to these Championships.

Important: Any competitor that attains their relevant award or Pool Evaluation/Competition Evaluation after the close of entries on Sunday 19th October 2025, and prior to the start of competition on Friday 31st October, MAY still be eligible to compete at the 2025 North Australian Championships provided that they can satisfy the following:

- *The award/assessment/test MUST be processed and entered on Surfguard by the competitor's respective Branch no later than 5.00pm on Thursday 30th October 2025.*

Entries for these members, as listed above (i.e. gaining awards after the close of entries), will need to be done as follows:

All competitors **MUST** have completed and signed the SLSA Association Application for Membership Form and paid any required membership fees.

It is also **MANDATORY** that all competitors (including reel party members of Belt Race teams) are entered.

PLEASE NOTE:

It is an offence to enter a person who does not meet the requirements as listed above ('Entry Conditions'), and any irregularities will be considered by the Branch or State Surf Sports Committees. Random checks of all entries will be carried out upon receipt (i.e. award details). Any Club entry found to be incorrectly completed will be dealt with accordingly.

Penalties

Entry of competitors that are ineligible due to non-qualification, award deficiencies or other breaches of Association or Club entry regulations, have penalties provided for as follows:

- The penalty for breach of entry regulations for the 2025 North Australian Surf Life Saving Championships will be the automatic rejection of entries for those persons found to be in breach of regulations and the forfeiture of their entry fees.
- Application of the automatic penalty will not preclude further disciplinary action by the Association against Clubs or other persons if deemed appropriate in the case of serious attempt to defeat Association regulations.

ENTRY REGISTRATIONS

Entries are invited from all Clubs within Queensland and the Northern Territory, for the events as listed under (Competition Events) in this Bulletin.

The method of entry is via Live Heats – the name of the carnival is '2025 North Australian Championships'.

ENTRY FEES

The entry fee per competitor at the 2025 North Australian Championships is \$40.00 (inc GST) per person regardless of the number of events entered.

Nominations received at Surf Life Saving Queensland after the close of entries on midnight Sunday 19th October 2025 will incur a late fee of \$40.00 (Inc GST) PLUS the original entry fee of \$40.00 (inc GST)

There is No entry fee for the Adaptive Events.

Any team changes or additions to existing nominations after midnight on the 20th October 2025 can be done by Team Managers on Liveheats. Any new nominations from the 20th October will incur a late fee as prescribed above.

Late nominations (which will incur a penalty fee) and/or additional event nominations to original entries for the Pool Rescue events must be completed prior to the start of competition of these events.

NOTES ON EVENTS

Timetable of Events

The DRAFT Timetable of Events for the 2025 NAC will be released as the event draws closer. The FINAL Timetable of Events will be issued with the Final Carnival Bulletin. There are however, some key programming points to be aware of, which are subject to change at any time, including:

- Pool Rescue Competition Events – Friday afternoon 31st October 2025 – 11am start
- March Past – Saturday morning 1st November 2025 – 7.15am start
- Surf Boat Championship – Saturday afternoon 1st November 2025 – 1.00pm start
- Lifesaver Relay – Saturday afternoon 1st November 2025 – Time TBC
- 1km and 2km Beach Runs – Sunday morning 2nd November 2025 – 7.00am start (TBC)

Masters' Team Events

Age limits of 3-person team races will again this year be restricted to only one age category – 110 Years Minimum Male and 110 Years Minimum Female (ocean events), 140 Years Minimum Male and 140 Years Minimum Female (beach events), and 120 Years Minimum (surf boat events).

Under 11 to Under 14 Events

All U11, U12, U13 and U14 Team events, excluding the Board Rescue events, will be 'Open' events – i.e. teams may be comprised of male and/or female competitors. The only events that will be 'gender-based' events are the Board Rescue events (and pool rescue medley relays).

Under 15, Under 17 Team Events

All U15 and U17 Team events, excluding the Board Rescue events, will be 'Open' events – i.e. teams may be comprised of male and/or female competitors. The only events that will be 'gender-based' events are the Board Rescue events (and pool rescue medley relays).

Competitors Competing 'Up' in Team Events

Competitors are permitted to compete 'up' in another age group in TEAM events as per the SLSA rules and regulations that relate to this (please seek clarification from the SLSA Surf Sports Manual and/or subsequent Bulletins if you are unsure) – AND abiding by 4.11 'Age Group Restrictions' on page 6 of this Bulletin – HOWEVER, please note that events will NOT be held up for this to occur.

Similarly, events will not be held up whilst competitors are waiting for gear and equipment to arrive from other areas or events.

ADAPTIVE EVENTS

For the first time, Surf Life Saving Queensland will be offering dedicated Adaptive Surf Sport events for competitors with a disability. The event program has been designed based on a process of consultation and feedback conducted by SLSA over the past 24 months.

In this first year a selected program will be on offer as participation events. Events will feature adaptations and modifications to maximise participation and ensure an accessible and enjoyable opportunity for all competitors. This will not be a Championships event in 2024 (with no Championship medals or placings awarded), however competitors will receive an inaugural medal celebrating its inclusion.

This year's inaugural program will lay the foundation for further refinement and development of robust, fair and meaningful competition in future years.

The Adaptive Surf Sport events will be held on Sunday, 2nd November 2025. Timings will be confirmed closer to the event.

Competitors may enter their preferred event distance however may only enter one distance per event. All event distances are dependent on conditions and may be further modified as required, based on final Entries.

Events and age groups may be combined to ensure viable events based on number of entries per event/age group.

Note: Athletes with disability may additionally or alternatively enter any other standard (non-Adaptive) event if they hold the required awards and meet required proficiencies.

All competitors must be a current financial member of a Surf Life Saving Australia affiliated surf club. There are no patrol hours requirements for Adaptive Surf Sport Competitors. All competitors must additionally meet the event eligibility requirements below.

BEACH SPRINT/RUN/FLAGS ELIGIBILITY

There are no prerequisite requirements to enter these events however the competitor must be capable of completing the required skills/distance with or without their handler's assistance.

SURF SWIM/WADE/BOARD ELIGIBILITY

Competitors who hold a proficient Surf Rescue Certificate or proficient Bronze Medallion may enter surf events.

Competitors who do not hold a proficient Surf Rescue Certificate or proficient Bronze Medallion may enter surf events however must have a mandatory water safety handler (minimum 1:1 ratio) and must be capable of completing the required skills/distance with or without handler assistance.

CATEGORISATION

Categorisation is the process of grouping competitors based on their diagnosed health condition and impact of impairment on sport participation. It is designed to ensure fair and meaningful competition for athletes with a disability.

In 2025 competitors will be grouped into a single “Open category” for all Adaptive events. Additional categories may be introduced in subsequent years as participation grows.

To be eligible for the Open category the competitor must have a permanent health condition or impairment which causes activity limitation or participation restriction. Including, but not limited to:

- Intellectual impairment
- Autism
- Down syndrome
- Hearing loss/Deafness
- Vision loss/Blindness
- Muscle power impairment (e.g. spinal cord injury, muscular dystrophy, post-polio syndrome and spina bifida.)
- Passive range of movement impairment (e.g. arthrogryposis and contracture resulting from chronic joint immobilisation or trauma affecting a joint)
- Limb deficiency/Loss (e.g. amputation, congenital limb deficiency)
- Short stature (e.g. achondroplasia, growth hormone dysfunction, and osteogenesis imperfecta)
- Hypertonia, Ataxia, Athetosis (e.g. cerebral palsy, traumatic brain injury, stroke, multiple sclerosis)
- Transplant recipient (e.g. organ, blood or stem cell transplant)

In this first year SLSQ seek to make the process of Categorisation eligibility as simple as possible and as such athletes will be required to submit the below evidence.

- Diagnosis or medical condition details
- Related impairment type details
- Individual accessibility needs
- Individual support needs
- Other sport specific classification details

Collecting this information will assist SLSQ to:

- Identify individual accessibility and support needs for implementation during competition.
- Identify specific event modifications that may need to be implemented during competition.
- Further refine and develop formal categorisation for future years.

HANDLERS

Any competitor may optionally employ one or more handlers to provide reasonable and necessary assistance during any event.



A handler is mandatory for all competitors entered into surf events who do not hold a proficient Surf Rescue Certificate or proficient Bronze Medallion.

A handler must be a current financial and active SLSA member and hold a proficient Surf Rescue Certificate or proficient Bronze Medallion.

ACCESSIBILITY AND OTHER SUPPORTS

MOBILITY AIDS

SLSQ will work to ensure competition areas are as accessible as possible and will work to accommodate individuals who use mobility aids. A dedicated mobility aid storage area will be provided in close proximity to the Adaptive event arena. In addition SLSQ will provide on beach transport options should they be required (e.g. beach wheelchair, ATV). Competitors with specific needs related to mobility aids and venue access, please detail this in your eligibility application form.

ASSISTANCE ANIMALS

Assistance animals are welcome in all areas of the event and SLSQ will work to accommodate individuals who are accompanied by an assistance animal. Competitors with specific needs related to assistance animals please detail this in your eligibility application.

CARERS/SUPPORT WORKERS

All competitors are encouraged to engage their own carer/support worker to provide additional individual assistance during competition, if required.

SKI COACHING CLINIC

As part of the 2025 North Australian Championships SLSQ will be holding a Ski Coaching Clinic which is open to all interested Coaches and members that may wish to pick up some training tips as well as helping on their coaching journey.

The clinic will be conducted at Mackay Beach on Friday 31st October commencing at 9am.



AGE GROUP RESTRICTIONS

As per SLSA Rules & Regulations, Under 15 competitors are NOT permitted to compete 'up' in ANY other age group.

As per directives from the NAC Competition Committee Under 14 competitors are NOT permitted to compete 'up' in Under 15 INDIVIDUAL events at the 2025 NAC. However, Under 14 competitors with a current and proficient Surf Rescue Certificate are permitted to compete 'up' in Under 15 TEAM events.

Should an Under 14 competitor compete 'up' in an Under 15 OCEAN Team event, they will be required to wear their Marine Stinger Protective Clothing!

POOL RESCUE COMPETITION

Pool Rescue Events will be conducted on Friday 31st October from 11am to 7.00pm (Pool Booking – 10.30am to 7.30pm) at the Mackay Aquatics Recreation Centre, 193 Boundary Road, Ooralea.

CLARIFICATION – The NAC Competition Committee does NOT allow Under 14 competitors to compete up in Under 15 INDIVIDUAL events. Also, SLSA does NOT allow Under 15 competitors to compete up in any other age group for INDIVIDUAL AND TEAM events. However, the NAC Competition Committee will permit Under 15/Under 17 Combined relays in the Pool Rescue Competition ONLY.

Please refer to Item 9 for a list of Pool Rescue events.

NOMINATIONS for the Pool Rescue Competition are to be completed via Live Heats.

Pool Rescue Nominations will also close at midnight on Sunday 19th October, 2025.

All Clubs competing in the NAC Pool Rescue Competition will be required to provide a MINIMUM of one (1) TIMEKEEPER for the duration of the competition – this quota will be based on your total number of competitors entered for each session as follows:

- 1 to 15 competitors entered = 1 Timekeeper to be supplied
- 15+ competitors entered = 2 Timekeepers to be supplied

NB: Officials are not to be allocated as Timekeepers, please ensure that you have met both the Official and Timekeeper requirements for this event.

NAC Pool Rescue Competition Notes:

- The 100m Patient Tow with Rescue Tube & Fins Event is a TEAM EVENT and as such two (2) members MUST be nominated per team AND these members can only compete ONCE in each age in which they are competing.
- Under 11 to Under 13 competitors are only permitted to wear 'rubber' type fins that meet SLSA specifications.
- Under 14 to Masters competitors are permitted to wear any fins that meet SLSA/ILS specifications.
- Clubs/Competitors MUST supply their own Rescue Tubes for the Patient Tow, Manikin Tow & Medley Relay events.



- Competitors in Manikin Tow events MUST have a handler that is wearing a Club Competition Cap or Swim Cap.
- Swimwear worn by competitors (pool and ocean) at the NAC MUST be approved competition dress as detailed in Section 2.5 'Dress of Competitors' in the current edition of the Surf Sports Manual.
- All competitors from the same Club should be wearing the same Competition Cap or Swim Cap.

SURF BOAT COMPETITION

The North Australian Championships' Surf Boat events will be conducted on Saturday afternoon 1st November 2025 in the Open Men, Open Women, Under 23 Men, Under 23 Women, Under 19, Reserve Grade and Masters (120 Years Minimum) categories.

Please refer to Item 9 for a list of Surf Boat events.

BEACH RUNS

The 1km and 2km Beach Runs will be conducted on Sunday morning 2nd November 2025, from 7.00am (TBC).

QUEENSLAND COUNTRY JUNIOR REPRESENTATIVE TEAM

A Queensland Country representative team will be selected based on performances and results from the 2024 North Australian Championships, and any other applicable events. The team will be made up of U13, U14, U15 and U17 competitors (male and female) – with 6 male and 6 female competitors per age group.

A selection panel of four (4) people – including one (1) selector from each Branch, plus an independent Chairman – will be on hand at the Championships to select the Queensland Country Team. The Team will be announced at the conclusion of the Championships on Sunday 2nd November 2025.

Interested members are NOT required to nominate for selection in the Queensland Country Team – all U13, U14, U15 and U17 competitors at the Championships will be considered for selection.

VOLUNTEER (OFFICIAL/WATER SAFETY/IRB) REQUIREMENTS

In order to conduct the NAC successfully and to ensure the safety of all competitors, a MINIMUM of ten (10) operational IRB's are required for use over the duration of the Championships.

Clubs are therefore requested to consider supplying at least one (1) operational IRB – including motor – for use during the Championships. Any Club that supplies a fully operational and equipped IRB and motor for use during the entire Carnival will be awarded 50 points towards the Champion Club Overall Pointscore (can only be used for 1 boat).

If your Club is able to assist, could you please complete the attached form and return to the Event Manager **by no later than Friday the 10th of October, 2025.**

All IRB's are to be delivered to the Carnival on Friday the 31st of October (by no later than 5.00pm), where they are to be inspected by the IRB Coordinator and a checklist completed and signed off by both parties. The same process will be adhered to at the completion of the Carnival on Sunday the 2nd of November, when the vessels will be available to be collected by the respective Clubs.

Should the vessels be damaged during the course of the Carnival, Surf Life Saving Queensland will consider providing compensation to the Club/s involved after all quotations and repairs are verified.



PLEASE NOTE: IF THERE ARE INSUFFICIENT IRB's, DRIVERS & CREW SUPPLIED BY CLUBS, THE NAC COMPETITION COMMITTEE MAY IMPOSE A RESTRICTION ON CLUB NOMINATIONS OR ENFORCE MANDATORY SUPPLY BY CLUBS ACCORDING TO NUMBERS OF NOMINATIONS (i.e. The top 10 Clubs based on nominations may be forced to supply an IRB and Crew). NO POINTS WILL BE AWARDED IF THIS IS THE CASE.

ALL Clubs that have competitors in the U11 to U14 age groups MUST supply one (1) Water Safety Officer – with approved Water Safety Uniform – per every ten (10) competitors (i.e. 1 to 10 competitors = 1 water safety officer; 11 to 20 competitors = 2 water safety officers; etc.). This quota will be determined based on entries per Club once nominations have closed and will be enforced throughout the duration of the Championships under the direction of the Carnival Referee and the Water Safety Coordinator.

All Official, Water Safety Personnel and IRB Duty Boat Crews MUST adhere to the SLSQ Screening Policy and possess a valid 'Working with Children Suitability Card'.

DRESS OF COMPETITORS

In all events, competitors must wear approved competition dress as detailed in the current edition of the Surf Sports Manual and any other subsequent Bulletins or Circulars. To promote competitor safety and assist with competitor identification, competitors and handlers entering the water beyond knee depth are required to wear approved hi vis as their top layer of clothing. Refusal to comply renders the clothing, competition apparel or equipment ineligible for the competition and the competitor and/or team would be ineligible for further participation in the event.



High Visibility Lycra Vests

As per SLSQ High Visibility Clothing Policy, ALL competitors competing in ocean events at the 2024 North Australian Championships will be required to wear a High Visibility Lycra Vest that is Fluro Pink in colour.

Clubs and competitors are also reminded that these Lycra Vests MUST meet the requirements of the 'SLSA Competition Sponsorship Policy 5.8' and be approved by the NAC Competition Committee should there be concerns regarding conflicting sponsorships or other details.

Marine Stinger Protective Clothing

In abiding by the information and guidelines contained within the latest SLSQ Marine Stinger Risk Management Guidelines (LS26 – approved 26.10.2022), the following rules and regulations have been put in place for the 2025 North Australian Championships:

- It will be COMPULSORY for all U11, U12, U13 and U14 competitors to wear appropriate and approved Marine Stinger PPE during ALL water (OCEAN) events throughout the duration of the Championships.
- At this stage, according to the Guidelines/Policy, U15, U17, U19, Open and Masters Competitors will NOT be required to wear appropriate and approved Marine Stinger PPE UNLESS weather conditions, sting treatments, stinger captures, risk assessments or the NAC Carnival Referee and/or Carnival Safety Officer and/or Competition Committee dictate otherwise.

ALL U15, U17, U19, Open and Masters Competitors are strongly advised to bring appropriate and approved Marine Stinger PPE with them to the Championships as the Carnival Referee may at any time during the Championships enforce the wearing of such Protective Clothing by ALL or ANY competitors in ALL water events.

Beach Events

A compulsory long sleeve garment must be worn by U11 – U14 competitors in the beach events (Sprints, Flags and Relays).

EVENT MEDALS, TROPHIES & POINTSCORE

Points and Medal Allocations

The following rules will apply to the 2024 NAC with respect to point's allocation in all 'finals' event:

1 st Place	-	6 points

For the 2025 NAC, medals will be awarded for all U11-U15 events. In addition, the following trophies/prizes will be awarded:

TEAM MANAGERS

Each club must have a Team Manager complete the online [TEAM MANAGER DECLARATION LINK](#) before their club is eligible to compete at this event.

Team Managers must ensure they complete the above online Team Managers Declaration for this event before Sunday 17th October, 2025. If your Club has more than one Team Manager, please have them complete the online declaration and specify what area/age group they will be managing.

Team Managers, Age Managers and Chaperones MUST adhere to the SLSQ Screening Policy and possess a valid 'Working with Children Suitability Card'.

PLEASE NOTE – the Championships Team Managers Meeting/Briefing will be held on Friday afternoon 31st October, commencing at 4.00pm, at the Mackay Aquatics & Recreation Complex – Ooralea.

It is COMPULSORY that ALL Club Team Managers attend the Team Managers/Briefings as outlined above.

PLEASE NOTE:

Late entries or amendments to entries for the Pool Rescue Competition Events will NOT be accepted after the briefing at 10.30am on Friday morning.

Late entries or amendments to entries for ALL other events at the North Australian Championships will NOT be accepted after 9am on Saturday morning.



It is the Team Managers responsibility to ensure the changes to the Club's competing teams have been registered with the appropriate officials, and that all their competitors are correctly entered in the event.

It is compulsory for all Team Managers (in their official roles) to wear clearly identifiable apparel that highlights their club name and the wording 'Team Manager' or 'Assistant Team Manager' OR they are to be otherwise suitable identified (i.e. badge, identification card etc.). Sectional Referees will NOT discuss any matter with a person or persons who do not possess such identification.

FIRST AID PERSONNEL

First Aid Personnel are to meet at the Mackay SLSC First Aid Room at 6.30am on Saturday and Sunday.

SCRUTINEERING

Random scrutineering and safety checks will take place throughout the duration of the Championships. Of particular interest will be the condition of boards – particularly the condition of fins.

MEDIA & PHOTOGRAPHY

Drones:

For the safety of competitors, officials and spectators SLSQ prohibits the use of drones or Unmanned Aerial Vehicles (UAV) at this event by members and/or public unless approved by SLSQ, 7 days prior to the event. The operator must supply an operations manual (including risk management plan), provide a copy of public liability insurance and comply with all Civil Aviation Safety Authority (CASA) requirements. SLSQ may utilise the use of our own drones to conduct aerial surveillance and monitor hazards.

Photography:

As a condition of entry, all competitors agree to have photos and video taken during the event used for promotional material by SLSQ.

For the 2024 North Australian Championships each Club will be permitted two (2) accredited Club photographers per Club – one (1) Senior and one (1) Junior – that will be granted limited access within the competition arena (unless stipulated otherwise by the Carnival Referee) to take photographs of their Club competitors.

These Club Photographers **MUST** be accredited with an official 2024-2025 SLSQ Club Photographer Pass. Photographers within the carnival area must have a visible photographer's pass as well as their BlueCard.

HEALTH & WELLBEING

The welfare of all competitors and officials is of paramount importance and athletes or their parent/guardian in the case of underage competitors should seek advice prior to the competition from a qualified professional for any health concerns if required.

Any competitor or official who suffers illness or injury prior to or at the event must seek a medical clearance before resuming their normal activities which includes training and competition.

In addition, SLSQ may, at its sole discretion, require a competitor and/or official to be assessed for physical and/or psychological fitness to participate in the competition. This ensures the safety and wellbeing of the athlete concerned and fellow competitors while also ensuring all parties and SLSQ are not placed at risk.

SLSQ will be supplying adequate shade tents at all marshalling areas for officials and competitors throughout the event. It is highly recommended that all athletes ensure they carry with them adequate apparel to assist with reduction of sunburn, along with recommended use of sunscreen throughout the day.



Water barrels will be available under the marshalling tents for officials, team managers and competitor use. These barrels are in place for all persons to use and fill up their own water bottles. Please note, no drinking cups will be supplied.

ANTI-DOPING & MATCH FIXING

SLSQ affiliated with SLSA supports the Australian Government, the Australian Sports Commission, the Australian Olympic Committee, and the Australian Sports Anti-Doping Authority (ASADA) in their efforts to eradicate the use of drugs in sport.

It is strongly recommended that all Coaches and Team Managers complete the ASADA Level 1 Course as well as the Australian Governments Matching Fixing Course. Both of these courses are free of charge and provide an opportunity to develop a knowledge and understanding of anti-doping and match fixing in sport.

BEHAVIOUR/MISCONDUCT

Any misconduct while at the event will not be tolerated. This includes the days leading into the competition and any official social activities following the conclusion of the event. Offending members risk disciplinary action against both themselves and their Clubs.

Please refer to the Surf Sports Manual sections 2.27 *SLSA Code of Behavior* and 2.28 *Abuse/Inappropriate Behavior* and the Policy 6.5 *Member Protection Policy* (available online at the Members Portal).

PROTESTS

All protests shall be lodged with the appropriate Liaison Officer in accordance with procedures set down in the current edition of the Surf Sports Manual and any subsequent bulletins, and shall identify the specific sections/clauses in the Competition Manual and or event rules upon which the protest is based.

Protest Forms are available from the Liaison Officer. An 'Appeals Fee' of \$110 must accompany all documentation when the process is officially submitted to the Appeals Committee for adjudication.

CANCELLATION POLICY

The following Cancellation Fee and Refund Policy will be adhered to:

- If the carnival is cancelled, with no postponement before the first event is conducted, 75% of all entry fees will be refunded to all Clubs (25% retained for administration costs)
- If the carnival is cancelled, after the first event is conducted, no refund will be given
- If the carnival is postponed and re-scheduled to another date, a 75% refund will be issued to competing Clubs that cannot compete at the re-scheduled event

2025 NORTH AUSTRALIAN SURF LIFE SAVING CHAMPIONSHIPS

Additional Special Notice to all Club Secretaries and Touring Team Managers

Whilst the news media has been quick to publicly expose acts of unacceptable behaviour by various sporting groups traveling away from their Clubs, legal action by victims of sexual discrimination and harassment has also been threatened. Under the circumstances, it is hoped that Team Managers will accept the following recommendations in the right vein and ensure that the rights of members and the good name of Surf Life Saving Queensland and its traditions are upheld at all times. It is realized that "mixed teams" are common-place these days and that members tend to "let their hair down" after the Championships. However, this should be done within the bounds of good behaviour and not at the expense of the enjoyment and respect of others. Each Club is requested to ensure that the following actions and conditions are implemented.

1. Before Departure

- a) Each group of two or more Club members traveling to the North Australian Championships shall have a Team Manager duly appointed by the Club by resolution or action.
- b) That Team Managers shall be responsible to the Club and to Surf Life Saving Queensland for the conduct of all of their team members in traveling to, during and returning home from the North Australian Championships.
- c) Any group of two or more members who depart the main body of the team for the purposes of travel or for any other reason, shall have a "sub-manager" appointed by the Team Manager for the duration of their departure.
- d) Team Managers shall at all times exercise control over their teams and ensure their conduct and appearance does not have an adverse bearing upon the good name of their Club or Surf Life Saving Queensland
- e) Members who wish to depart the main body and remain in an area or proceed with independent travel arrangements, at the conclusion of the carnival, should give sufficient prior notice to their Club and secure the Club and Team Manager's permission. Clubs are urged to have a policy attitude towards such breaking up of teams at the conclusion of the carnival. In the case of members under the age of 18 years, Clubs should secure a clear indication of approval of such actions from parents or guardians.

2. Travel

- a) Special care should be taken at high density congregation points especially air terminals and during flight trips. Airlines have received instructions regarding the permissible conduct of groups as laid down by the Australian Government Department of Transport. Extract of such instruction states:
"Air Navigation Orders" state in part
247 (1) A person shall not, while in a state of intoxication, enter any aircraft; and
312 (2) A person shall not while in the aircraft
 - i) interfere with a crew member;
 - ii) behave in a disorderly or offensive manner;
- iii) do any act that threatens the safety of the aircraft.
Note: A person who contravenes or fails to comply with these Regulations or who attempts to commit an offence against these Regulations is guilty of an offence.
- b) Before departing your accommodation point, the Team Manager and another senior member of the team should conduct an inspection of the rooms accompanied by the Hotel/Motel Manager. It should be confirmed that no complaints are being made, nor will be made (re the team's conduct or condition of the accommodation fixtures).

3. Sexual Harassment

It is difficult to make an exhaustive list of the forms that sexual harassment can take, however, the conduct must be sexual, unwelcome and uninvited. This includes: unwanted physical contact; verbal comments or abuse and/or offensive gestures and depending upon the circumstances, be considered unlawful. Allegations of sexual harassment can arouse strong emotions and if a claim is found to be true, serious consequences can follow.

- a) Team Managers should make it clear to all members that sexual harassment will not be tolerated under any circumstances.
- b) Complaints must be treated seriously and sympathetically
- c) Investigation of complaints must be strictly confidential and impartial
- d) Investigations should be made promptly after complaints are lodged
- e) All parties involved should be interviewed separately to obtain an accurate detail of the incident
- f) Where a complaint is substantiated, appropriate conciliatory or disciplinary action should be taken
- g) Following this decision, later checks should be made to ensure that the behaviour has stopped and the complainant is not be victimized as a result of the complaint.

4. General

- a) Clubs are requested to ensure that their Team Manager's report is speedily received after the Championships and any report of misconduct is appropriately and immediately dealt with.
- b) Extreme caution is suggested in the subject of exchanging of club's identified garments and, in fact, clubs are urged to instruct their members of a policy in this subject. Many incidents have been recorded of misconduct being attributed to a particular club whereas it has been other person wearing their garments.
- c) Please remember that the venue of the North Australian Championships are the traditional support bases of a great many local clubs and misconduct will certainly be noticed and jeopardise future activities of those clubs. You can readily imagine the situation applied in reverse.
- d) It should be noted that a Judiciary Committee will be formed and will be ready for an urgent meeting in the event of any complaint. Such Committee will have the power to also act at that time and shall have jurisdiction over any lifesaver attending the North Australian Championships.
- e) Clubs are urged to ensure that clear policies are in place in respect to touring with members under the age of 18 years and that appropriate arrangements are made with parents/guardians prior to departure and that appropriate supervision is in place at all times.
