Introduction

This policy recognises and rewards members for their valued contribution to Cairns Surf Life Saving Club (CSLSC). The Club relies on member commitment and contribution, and this policy provides a structured and fair framework to acknowledge outstanding service, performance, and leadership.

Purpose

The purpose of this policy is to:

- Define the process for nominating and selecting recognition awards; and
- Ensure alignment with Surf Life Saving Queensland (SLSQ) and Surf Life Saving Australia (SLSA) Recognition Awards frameworks.

CSLSC recognises that:

- Some awards align with SLSQ Awards of Excellence and may progress to Branch and State level, and
- Other awards are designed for club level recognition only.

Award Categories

SLSQ Aligned Pathway Awards

SLSQ Aligned Pathway Awards are awards that:

- Exist within the SLSQ Awards of Excellence Recognition Award Matrix;
- Align with SLSQ and SLSA eligibility, naming conventions, age definitions and intent; and
- May progress from Club → Branch → SLSQ, and where applicable to SLSA.

Only awards listed as *SLSQ-Aligned Pathway Awards* in the CSLSC Recognition Awards Matrix are eligible for progression beyond CSLSC.

Key principles

- Selection is based on merit and evidence against published criteria.
- Popular voting does not apply to SLSQ-aligned awards.
- Where appropriate, CSLSC may determine more than one nominee.

Club Only Recognition Awards

Club Only Recognition Awards:

- Recognise leadership, culture, service, junior development or heritage within CSLSC; and
- Do not progress to Branch, SLSQ, or SLSA levels.

These awards are clearly identified as *Club Only* in the Recognition Awards Matrix and exist solely for CSLSC recognition.

Surf Sports Performance Awards

Surf Sports Performance Awards:

- Are determined by competition results, points or performance outcomes; and
- Recognise athletic excellence within the club competition season.

These awards are not part of the SLSQ Awards of Excellence framework and do not progress beyond CSLSC.

Service and Participation Awards

Service and Participation Awards recognise:

- Patrol, water safety and other service contributions; and
- Length of service and qualifications formally recorded in Surfguard.

Service certificates and national service awards are issued in accordance with SLSQ and SLSA processes.

General Conditions

- All nominees must be SLSA financial members.
- Age eligibility is determined as at 30 September of the relevant season.
- Winners may be required to act as ambassadors for CSLSC.
- Nominations focus primarily on the current season with consideration of the previous three years.

Nominations and Selection

6.1 Nominations

- Any financial CSLSC member may submit a nomination unless otherwise specified.
- Nominations must address the published criteria for the award.
- Separate closing dates may apply for pathway awards to ensure alignment with Branch and SLSQ timelines.

6.2 Awards Panel

The CSLSC Board will appoint an Awards Panel responsible for:

- Assessing nominations against criteria;
- Determining award recipients; and
- Endorsing nominees for Branch and SLSQ consideration.

6.3 Voting

- Member voting may be used for Club Only Recognition Awards where approved by the Board.
- Voting is **not permitted** for SLSQ-aligned pathway awards.

The Awards Panel will also determine if a trophy does not have sufficient nominees to be awarded. Any panel members who have been nominated for an award may not vote for that award.

Appendix A – Awards and Criteria (Revised, Aligned)

A1. Lifesaving and Membership Development Awards

U18 Lifesaver of the Year (Haug Family Trophy) *(Club Only Recognition Award)*

This award recognises members under the age of 18 who have demonstrated outstanding contribution to lifesaving and club activities.

Note: This award does not progress to SLSQ and exists for club recognition only.

Key criteria

- Overview of the nominee and their involvement
- Awards and qualifications held
- Patrol hours and reliability
- Roles within the club (for example, youth officer, team manager, coaching support)
- Participation in development or leadership programs
- Initiative in identifying and addressing a need or issue
- Key achievement during the season
- Innovation or new approaches to achieving outcomes
- Ability to overcome challenges
- Impact of contributions and who benefited
- Demonstrated influence on others

Young Lifesaver of the Year (John 'Choko' Wright Trophy)

(SLSQ Aligned Pathway Award, Age 15–21)

Recognises an active patrolling member who has made an outstanding contribution to frontline lifesaving services.

Key criteria

- Roles, responsibilities and leadership contributions
- Demonstration of positive and supportive behaviours
- Initiative in response to identified needs
- Innovation or new approaches
- Contribution and impact within the club
- Ability to identify and address club needs
- Key challenge and how it was overcome

Surf Lifesaver of the Year (Jon Menico Trophy)

(SLSQ Aligned Pathway Award)

Recognises an active patrolling member who has made an outstanding contribution to frontline lifesaving services.

Key criteria

- Contribution across patrol, surf sports and training
- Leadership and positive attitude
- Roles and responsibilities held
- Demonstrated influence and inspiration of others
- Initiative in identifying and addressing needs
- Ability to think differently and improve outcomes
- Key challenge and how it was overcome
- Distinguishing qualities compared to peers

Volunteer of the Year (Robert 'Bear' Crawford Trophy)

(SLSQ Aligned Pathway Award)

Recognises significant voluntary contribution beyond frontline patrol duties.

Key criteria

- Roles and responsibilities undertaken
- Positive behaviours and leadership
- Initiative and innovation
- Impact across the club or organisation
- Ability to inspire others
- Challenges overcome
- Breadth of club involvement

Club Person of the Year (Matthew Family Trophy)

(Clive Hammond OAM aligned)

Recognises outstanding contribution to club development and wellbeing.

Key criteria

- Leadership and commitment
- Positive behaviours and culture contribution
- Response to identified needs
- Innovation and improvement
- Impact on the club
- Influence on others
- Challenges overcome

Team Manager of the Year

Recognises a member who has made significant voluntary contributions as a team manager.

Key criteria

- Leadership and organisation
- Roles and responsibilities
- Support and development of athletes
- Positive behaviours and communication
- Additional achievements

Trainer of the Year (Chris Auger Trophy)

Recognises an endorsed trainer delivering high-quality learning and development.

Key criteria

- Roles at club, branch or state level
- Courses delivered
- Initiative in response to needs
- Innovation in training
- Positive behaviours and engagement
- Influence on others
- Challenges overcome

Assessor of the Year (Bill Smith Trophy)

Recognises an endorsed assessor delivering high-quality assessment and support.

Key criteria

- Initiative and improvement
- Positive behaviours
- Influence and mentoring
- Challenges overcome

Services to Junior Activities (Club Only)

Recognises outstanding contribution to junior activities.

Key criteria

Rookie Coach of the Year

Recognises emerging coaches (≤ 2 years' experience).

Key criteria

- Coaching duration and development
- Qualifications or progress toward qualifications
- Coaching achievements
- Competition involvement
- Positive behaviours

Official of the Year (Adrian Davies-Roe Trophy)

(SLSQ Aligned Pathway Award)

Recognises excellence in officiating and development of officials.

Key criteria

- Officiating qualifications
- Roles across competition levels

- Contributions to education and mentoring
- Alignment with SLISA values and policies
- Personal development

Rookie Official of the Year

Recognises emerging officials (≤ 2 years' experience).

Key criteria

- Officiating involvement
- Qualifications or development
- Competition experience
- Positive behaviours

A3. Junior and Youth Awards

Junior Athlete of the Year (Green Family Trophy)

Recognises sporting excellence and contribution (ages 11–14).

Key criteria

- Competition performance
- Representative participation
- Sportsmanship and role modelling
- Contribution to club activities
- Engagement with other members

U14 Lifesaver of the Year (Grant Family Trophy)

Recognises outstanding contribution to junior lifesaving.

Key criteria

- Participation across lifesaving, sport and training
- Leadership and attitude
- Patrol or water safety involvement
- Club, school or community achievements
- Distinguishing qualities
